




Welcome to our three campuses, our Milnthorpe Road Campus, Arts & Media Campus and Westmorland Campus!

The Allen Building

The Allen Building is the hub of the Arts & Media Campus. It contains classrooms, workshops, Mac suites, a recording studio, sound booths, digital art suites, and more! It is also where the reception, Student Services, Inclusion Services and the café are based.

The Box

The Box is a stunning, dedicated performance venue, famous for its 'twisted cube' slate construction.

A state-of-the-art theatre, it provides a fantastic learning space for performing arts, music and theatre event technology & stage management students.

Kendal Museum

Run by the college, it is one of the oldest museums in the country and houses a fascinating collection.

The Wildman Gallery & Studios

The Wildman Street Gallery & Studios includes a gallery space, a textile and photography studio, specialist workshops, dance studios, theatrical & technical space, and a landscaped courtyard space for outdoor performances.

The Milnthorpe Road Campus is conveniently located to the south of Kendal and is just a 15-minute walk into town. The campus offers a wide variety of courses, as well as professional public facilities for the community to enjoy.

We are constantly evolving, providing our students with state-of-the-art environments to learn in and be inspired. With the introduction of T-Levels, we built a £3.4 million T-Level Engineering & Construction Block, to train the engineers and construction workers of the future. Facilities include CNC and 3D printing workshops, an electrical lab, and a maker space facility to enable students to turn their ideas into reality.

We have created two new health suites, including a clinical care environment to replicate real-life settings. In recent years, we revamped our café, installed new hybrid and electrical automotive workshops, and opened a newly refurbished Animal Rescue Centre.

The Learning Centre

The Network Team and The Student Experience and Progression (SEPO) Team are based here. SEPOs can support you with work and industry placements, careers appointments, CV workshops, mock interviews and job/university applications. SEPOs are also your main contact for your attendance.

House of Hair & Beauty

The House of Hair & Beauty is our professional hair and beauty training centre. As a student, you will receive 25% off hairdressing services and beauty treatments and 10% off any products.

The Restaurant

The Restaurant is our fine dining restaurant, open to the public for lunches Tuesday to Thursday and evening meals on Wednesdays.

The Café

In the café, you will find comfy sofas and a large balcony with views of Kendal Castle. Students are welcome to bring their own packed lunch or purchase food from the café.





During 2025/26 our Westmorland campus will expand to be the home of many of our full-time departments, including KC Sixth and our Business School.

We have completed the current phase of refurbishment to create well-equipped new classrooms, specialist rooms such as science labs and study spaces. The new open central atrium space provides social and study areas, as well as being a fantastic venue for college-wide events and celebrations. The next phase of refurbishment work will further enhance and enrich the current student learning, studying and socialising spaces to create a welcoming, vibrant and enjoyable college campus environment.


The campus also offers a range of support services available to all students, including careers, inclusion services, safeguarding and wellbeing.

Student Governors and learner voice

Kendal College is YOUR college, and we value your views and ideas. We recruit Student Governors, who sit on the Board of Governors, the college's highest decision-making body. You will also have the chance to have your say in your termly Learner Voice session with your SEPO, and the chance to be nominated to attend our Student Conference and Principal's Question Time.

IT software

We use Microsoft Office 365 at Kendal College. Once you start your studies, you can download and install the entire Office suite on up to five devices.

Tutor support

Every full-time student has a personal tutor and apprentices have a dedicated facilitator. They will deliver regular tutorial and progression sessions and meet with you individually to review your progress and set targets. You will also be supported by the wider course tutor team, and they will liaise with your parents/guardians (if you give consent) to help you achieve your study goals.

Your wellbeing

Your wellbeing and health are important to us. We offer 1-1 appointments and a dedicated wellbeing website. The appointments are person-centred and offer a chance to discuss your situation in a non-judgemental environment. Support is offered with a focus on safety planning, advocacy, and empowering problem-solving. More information is available at kendal.ac.uk/wellbeing.

Inclusion Services

We provide a wrap-around service, from application to qualification, for students with a range of disabilities or learning differences such as dyslexia, dyspraxia, autism, a physical or sensory impairment or a mental health need that impacts your learning.

Inclusion Services is also the first point of contact for learners who have an Education Health and Care Plan and for learners who require exam access arrangements or other reasonable adjustments to remove barriers to learning. Please ensure you mark on your application form if you have any learning needs, as this helps us ensure the best service for you.

English and Maths

If you don't yet have a GCSE grade 9-4 in English or Maths, then these classes will be part of your study programme. Our experienced tutors will work with you to improve our skills and achieve higher grades, supporting your future progression to employment or other courses.

Add Core Maths

It may be possible to study Level 3 Mathematical Studies (Core Maths) alongside your course. Core Maths focuses on applying mathematics to solve relevant everyday problems and will prepare you for the mathematical demands of higher-level courses and employment.

We offer qualifications from Entry Level to Level 7

Please see the individual course information on the website for entry requirements.

For full-time courses, if you haven't any previous experience of a technical area, e.g. motor vehicle, hairdressing etc, you may need to start on a Level 1 or 2 course to gain the basic practical skills first.

For apprenticeships, the appropriate level of training relates to the job role and responsibilities.

Entry Level

Courses are normally suitable for people who want to build up their personal and study skills, and are a good stepping stone to a Level 1 course.





Level 1

Courses are normally suitable for people who have gained 2 GCSEs at grade 1 and above or who want to study a practical or skills based course.

Level 2

Courses are normally suitable for people who have gained 4 GCSEs at grade 3 and above or who want to study a practical/skills based course. Level 2 courses are equivalent to 5 GCSEs at grade 4 and above.

The T-Level Foundation programme is designed to prepare you for your chosen T-Level. They will enable you to develop your English and Maths, practical, technical and study skills, and provide work experience to help you excel in your T-Level.

Level 3

Courses are normally suitable for people who have either completed a Level 2 practical/skills-based course and want to progress or have gained 5 GCSEs at grade 4 and above and want a course with some academic learning, e.g. A-Levels, T-Levels or a Professional and Technical course that is equivalent to 3 A-Levels.

Levels 4, 5, 6 and 7

Courses are degree-level and postgraduate courses. Students will need to have completed a Level 3 qualification to progress on to the Level 4 courses.



KC Sixth

At KC Sixth, we promote a culture of high academic standards and performance, promoting commitment, independence and personal growth. We strive to inspire and enable all A-Level learners to achieve their full potential.

Our highly qualified and experienced teachers will guide you through your academic programme, offering three interactive and inspiring lessons per subject per week, as well as 'curiosity activities' and regular assessment and feedback to enable you to achieve.

We offer a wide range of A-Levels and offer pathways which include science, law, humanities, social sciences and maths, alongside the flexibility to choose and tailor your own programme.

You can choose up to four subjects as part of your study programme, and this will also include tutorials and study groups to ensure that your timetable is individualised to the programme you have chosen.

There are also additional opportunities available to A-Level learners, including a residential trip and the opportunity to complete the Bronze, Silver or Gold Duke of Edinburgh.

A-Levels at Kendal College

As part of being a KC Sixth A-Level learner, you will have regular contact time with our Academic Mentor and KC Sixth Curriculum Lead to support your progress and achievement; the aim of this is to help you succeed to the very best of your ability. Our department also works closely with the Inclusion Services and Wellbeing Team.

Our students progress to a range of universities and apprenticeship employers. You'll be guided through each step, from exploring all the options, making a UCAS or job application, to writing a personal statement and preparing for interview.





A-Levels

A-Level students typically choose three subjects and those with very high entry qualifications may apply to study four.

An Extended Project Qualification (EPQ) and/or Core Maths may be undertaken as part of your A-Level studies to help showcase your academic skills for university applications.

Life at KC Sixth

A typical day

At college your timetable is designed specifically for A-Level study. You will have 3 lessons per subject per week, typically for 1½ hours, enabling you to explore topics in-depth and make the step up from GCSE confidently. Depending on the subjects, you may have time between lessons, giving you the opportunity to keep up-to-date with independent study.

Academic mentoring and progress reviews

Your academic mentor will work with you regularly to support your study. They are your guide through successful A-Level study. You will also meet each term with the college's KC Sixth Curriculum Lead to have an honest appraisal of your progress which will help you improve and reach your goals.

Pastoral support

There may be things that affect your ability to study whilst you are at college. Your academic mentor will be the first person you can talk to, but from there we can direct you to more specialist services as required. We will offer to support you so that you can stay focused on your study.

Student support

There are opportunities for study support during the timetabled sessions.

Target grades

All A-Level students will be set target grades that are based on their GCSE results. These target grades will be reviewed as part of the academic review process, and subject advice and guidance will be provided to support your progress and achievement.



Assessment

We believe students need to know exactly where they stand regarding their academic progress. We have assessment points throughout the year that will give you and the team around you a clear picture, and allow you and them to plan the next steps.

Our culture

There are no bells, and you call staff by their first name. You'll have independent study and share public areas with staff and other students. There is zero tolerance of bullying and other behaviour that interrupts study.



YOURBRIGHT

Many of our students go on to higher-level study, attaining degrees in a wide range of subject areas. Others progress directly into employment, higher-level apprenticeships or spend time travelling during a gap year.

Our courses and approach will expand your skills in creative problem solving, attention to detail, communication, teamwork, and leadership. This will make you highly adaptable and attractive to employers and universities.

Art & Design, UAL Foundation (1 Year)

There are a variety of progression options for agricultural students to consider.

She was the only woman in the UK selected to join the Sedna Epic expedition to the High Arctic in 2022. The team have also recently achieved a Silver Award for the Hedgehog Friendly Campus scheme!

➤ Academic and industry partners

We work with the University of Cumbria, the RSPCA inspectorate and wildlife hospitals, local veterinary practices and conservation organisations at both local and national levels. These links provide our students with work placements, insightful guest speakers and up-to-date industry knowledge.

➤ Inspiring trips and visits

As well as various local visits, you will have the opportunity to take part in international trips – last year's students went to Ecuador, Eswatini and South Africa!



Kendal College is excited to offer two different supported internship programmes. The programmes are specifically aimed at young people aged 17-25 with an EHCP who are ready to make the transition from education and aspire to paid employment.

DFN Project SEARCH

The supported internship is a 5 day-a-week programme based within the NHS, at Westmorland and Furness Hospital. Alongside learning valuable life and work skills, you will work in at least 3 different areas, either within NHS departments, or in a workplace outside of the hospital. Our placements are bespoke and based on the skill set you need to achieve your final employment outcome, careers aspirations and interests. Throughout the programme, you will have the support of a workbased tutor and job coach, and a workplace mentor.



Our courses will expand your communication, teamwork, time management, organisation and English and Maths skills. This will support you in moving on to employment and/or to other courses in the college.

In the last few years, our Foundation Learning students have progressed to a range of full-time vocational courses, including hospitality, art and design, animal care and the supported internship. They have also gained employment in the local community, health and social care, and retail.

Successful completion of the Supported Internship is likely to lead to paid employment with the NHS or other placement providers. Nationally 5.1% of young people with a learning difference gain employment, but 75% of those supported by DFN Project SEARCH and Kendal College secure paid roles after graduation.

FAQs

What transport is available to get to college?

The college works with Stagecoach to offer discounted bus passes to students, and runs a number of dedicated services in Lancashire, Eden and South Lakeland. There is financial support for students living in low-income households or experiencing financial hardship. We can also provide you with information and advice about other options, such as car sharing and local council transport. A car park permit is available to college students. Are there any course fees?

Full-time courses and apprenticeships are free to students aged 16-18. You need to be 18 or under on 31st August of the relevant academic year. For example, if you wish to start a full-time course in September 2026, you will need to be 18 or under on 31/08/2026.

What kit and equipment will I need?

Some courses may require you to purchase equipment for your course. More information will be given when you apply and are offered a place. If you have any questions about a specific course, please contact us.

What are the options for lunch?

Our cafés offer a range of homemade food and cater for all dietary needs. Alternatively, you are welcome to bring a packed lunch or go off campus.

Can I get help with the costs of coming to college?

Financial support is available to students in low-income households or in financial hardship. We administer a government Bursary Fund to support students, which can help pay for things like transport, equipment, trips, emergency living costs and other expenses.
