

Introduction

During the programme, you will work towards completing the DFN Project SEARCH employability curriculum and NHS mandatory training. You will also take part in a series of job placements, known as rotations, throughout the academic year. These placements provide real, hands-on experience in a variety of work sectors, allowing you to develop key transferable skills such as communication, teamwork, time management, and problem-solving.

In addition to preparing you for employment, the Supported Internship will also support your wider transition into adulthood. You will grow in confidence and independence, improve your social and self-advocacy skills, and gain a clearer understanding of your goals and potential. This is an exceptional opportunity to build the foundation for your adult life and long-term success.

Summer preparation

Before starting in September, you will be encouraged to consider areas of work that interest or inspire you. You will be invited to attend an assessment day where you will meet your tutor, job coach, and other interns on the programme. As part of your enrolment, you will also be invited to college to complete a DBS application with support from your tutor and the college's HR team. You may also have the opportunity to visit the host business to familiarise yourself with the workplace environment.
