What is an Apprenticeship?

An apprenticeship is a real job that combines practical work experience with structured training. It's a pathway to building a career while earning a wage and gaining qualifications.

Benefits of an Apprenticeship

- You'll be employed with a formal contract
- Earn a salary and receive paid holidays
- Spend 20% of your time in dedicated training
- Receive guidance from an experienced mentor
- Take part in regular progress reviews
- Learn job-specific skills and develop transferable skills
- Gain UCAS points and progress into higher education
- Advance in your chosen career path
- Work towards nationally recognised qualifications
- Open to people of all ability levels, including high-achieving learners
- Taught by professionals with industry experience
- Additional support available for learners with EHCPs or specific learning needs

Apprenticeships offer the perfect opportunity to earn while you learn, combining real-world experience with nationally recognised qualifications. With competitive salaries and the chance to study all the way up to Level 7 (equivalent to a master's degree), there has never been a better time to start an apprenticeship. You'll receive hands-on industry training, develop valuable skills, gain professional experience, and build the knowledge and confidence needed to succeed in your chosen career.

As of July 2026, the government's Find an Apprenticeship service listed 8,581 apprenticeship vacancies.



Your journey to an apprenticeship. Our step-by- step guide...

1. Research

Be thorough! Both the Kendal College and government's 'Find an Apprenticeship' websites have opportunities listed on them. Also, look out for our open events, contact employers directly with your CV, and call us for an informal chat about finding an apprenticeship.

Most importantly, don't be afraid to ask questions if you're unsure about anything!

2. Join our Talent Pool

Visit kendal.ac.uk/talent and complete the short form. We will store your details and preferences, then send you personalised updates of relevant apprenticeship vacancies.

3. Register on Apprenticeships.gov.uk

This website gives you more information about apprenticeships. Browse real stories, search for vacancies, and explore if an apprenticeship is for you.

4. Be prepared

Keep a list of your experiences, hobbies, and interests. Where possible, organise work experience and gain experience in the area that you would like an apprenticeship. These will all help with your application.

5. Apply for an apprenticeship

It is important to compare and match your experience with the job specification. Write about yourself and, if you find this difficult, ask your friends and family to give you a list of your qualities to help you start.

You are welcome to send us your draft CV/application form, and we will support you to make it the best it can be! Check all spelling, punctuation and grammar before you send it to the employer, and make sure any accompanying email or cover letter is professional.

6. Interview skills

When you are invited to an interview, preparation and research are key! You need to be able to show you have a good understanding of the career you wish to pursue, as well as understanding your potential employer and their business. It is vital to research the apprenticeship thoroughly.

7. College place

If you are successful and offered the job, we will invite you to college to take part in our screening process where you will meet a facilitator and the tutor.

8. Start your apprenticeship!



Apprenticeship levels & duration

Apprenticeship levels relate to the job role and your existing knowledge & skills in the industry, rather than previous academic qualifications.

There are four main types of apprenticeships:

- Intermediate Apprenticeships (Level 2)
- Advanced Apprenticeships (Level 3)
- Higher Apprenticeships (Level 4/5)
- Degree Apprenticeships (Level 6/7)

Duration of apprenticeships vary, for example:

- Level 3 Business Administrator – typically 12 to 18 months, plus End Point Assessment
- Level 3 Installation & Maintenance Electrician – 48 months, plus End Point Assessment

The appropriate level & duration of an apprenticeship will depend on a number of factors including:

- Your job role
- Your industry experience
- Your entry qualifications
- The apprenticeship standards available
